Music Teacher Job Description

OVERVIEW

The music teacher teaches music and movement classes to our toddler through 4K classes. Each class meets in the music room for 30 minutes once a week.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

- Create an environment that is conducive to promoting a love and enjoyment of music.
- This position requires enthusiasm, classroom leadership, and communication skills along with a warm and nurturing disposition.

CURRICULUM RESPONSIBILIITES

- Come to school prepared to teach the designated classes for that day.
- Determine units, as necessary, to prepare for special programing, enhance music knowledge, and promote a love of music
- Ensure music is developmentally appropriate for each age group being taught
- Use instruments, scarves, and other tools to enhance the music program

CHAPEL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Teach religious based songs to 3K and 4K classes that they can sing in Chapel services
- Lead the music during weekly chapel services
- Communicate with the church children's ministry leaders to determine appropriate songs to enhance each week's lessons

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- Ensure the safety and emotional well-being of the children in your care.
- Keep your classroom orderly and perform basic cleaning tasks to ensure the health and safety of the children within your care
- Ensure all health and safety requirements are being met within your classroom: blind cords wrapped up and out of reach, outlet covers in place, etc.
- Remain up to date with Health and Safety Training and CPR training as outlined in the Staff Handbook.

OTHER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Attend monthly faculty meetings as able.
- Prepare, communicate with parents, and follow through with the production of the following special events: The Christmas Sing-Along, The 4K Circus, The Spring Music Program, The 4K Graduation
- Maintain a positive relationship with the Church of Ascension and help children grow in their love of God through music.
